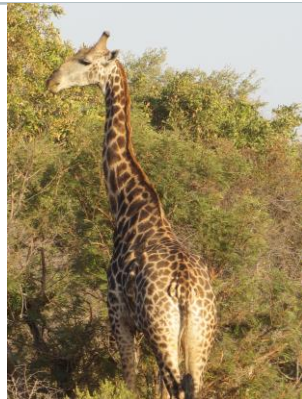

ITINERARY

July 9: Depart for Johannesburg.

July 10-11: Arrive and transfer to a hotel. Visit the apartheid museum and SOWETO.

July 12-14: Fly to Senalala Luxury Safari Camp in Kruger National Park. Enjoy morning and evening game drives and “sundowners.” Spend afternoons watching the watering hole for animal visitors. Take a guided hike in the bush.

July 15-17: Transfer to a private game reserve near the Indian Ocean. Possible activities include visiting a Zulu community, going on game drives, or even tracking rhino on foot.

July 18-21: Transfer to Cape Town. Enjoy day trips from Cape Town to a penguin colony, the most southern tip of Africa, the wine country via bikes (for those interested), Robben Island where Nelson Mandela was incarcerated, Kirstenbosch Botanical Gardens, Table Mountain and more.

July 22: Depart.
